

# **A BIBLIOGRAPHY OF BIRD IDENTIFICATION ARTICLES IN FIVE JOURNALS, WITH CROSS- REFERENCES TO A LIST OF OVER 650 SPECIES**

This bibliography was compiled to aid birders and researchers in locating identification information on birds which has been published in five journals. The five journals chosen are those most likely to be accessible to Oregon birders. Some journals are available in public libraries; for others it may be necessary to contact birders holding long-time subscriptions.

The references are listed in Part I by author. In order to include as many recent articles as possible, a section with additional references from 1986-1990 publications (with a few exceptions) follows the main list. Each reference has a unique number which is used in the phylogenetic cross-reference list of the bird species in Part II to refer the user to the appropriate articles. The phylogenetic listing of the species and the nomenclature follows the American Ornithologists' Union *Check-list of North American Birds* (Sixth Edition), 1983, as supplemented.

The quality of the identification information has not been evaluated for accuracy or usefulness. Those determinations are left to the user. The compiler tried to include any references which might be of some value, realizing that the smallest bit of information could be what the user is searching for. There are undoubtedly articles which will prove of little value, but most should have some relevant information. The "S.A." articles refer to those "Special Attention" boxes in *American Birds*. Due to time and energy constraints, this is the only information that could be compiled from the regional reports.

It is hoped this bibliography will prove useful to persons wishing identification information beyond the present field guides. The compiler is indebted to Tom Crabtree for suggesting this bibliography after spending 4 hours searching his journals for information on redpolls, to Jim Johnson for painstaking word processing, to Owen Schmidt for many helpful suggestions and to Kit Larsen for his patience in assisting with the 1990 revision.
